1. Name of eligibility change: Worker Supplement Benefit
2. Implementation date of eligibility change: July 1, 2012
3. Description of policy, including the change from prior policy: This program provides a $\$ 15$ monthly food benefit to SNAP households that meet the following criteria for the benefit month:

- Received SNAP benefits; and
- Did not include a member who is also receiving TANF cash assistance; and
- Included a minor child whose biological or adoptive parent resides in the same household; and
- Included at least one parent who is working 30 hours per week with the exception of a single parent with a child under age six who is required to work 20 hours per week; and
- Met the TANF financial eligibility requirements ; and
- Met the following TANF non-financial eligibility requirements: Age, Residence; Citizenship; Relationship and Maintenance of a home

2. Implementation date of eligibility change: February 1, 2012
3. Description of policy, including the change from prior policy: Prior sanction policy - For the first failure to comply, until the failure to comply ceased; for the second failure to comply, until the failure to comply ceased or 3 months, whichever was longer; for any subsequent failure to comply, until the failure to comply ceases, or 6 months whichever is longer.

New sanction policy - Initial sanction is a reduction to the adult portion of the benefit for 90 days or until compliance. If the adult doesn't comply by the $91^{\text {st }}$ day the entire case is closed. Subsequent sanctions result in case closure until compliance.
