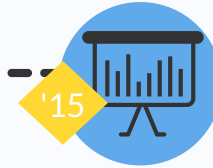
Maine Developmental Disabilities Council began to work on a developmental screening pilot with five different sites

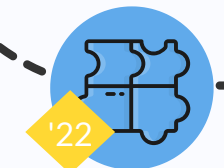
Governor J.Mills signed into law L.D. 1712: An Act To Support Children's Healthy Development and School Success

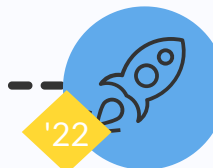
In Spring of 2022 Maine became affiliated with the Help Me Grow National Center
